

HEAVY HORSES

RULES AND REGULATIONS

EXHIBITORS ARE PARTICULARLY REQUESTED TO READ CAREFULLY ALL RULES GOVERNING THIS EXHIBITION. EXCEPTIONS TO THEM CANNOT BE MADE.

MEMBERSHIP AND ADMISSION TO GROUNDS

1. The payment of \$1.00 as annual Membership Fee shall constitute membership. Membership is not essential to the making of entries but area residents are invited to become members of the Society.

ENTRIES

2. **Entries in all LIVESTOCK Classes will close on July 10th.** Entries by mail must bear the postmark of the closing date or earlier.
3. All entries must be on the printed forms of the Society. Extra forms may be obtained on request. Forms should be filled in and signed by exhibitor. In all cases the right is reserved to reject any entry on application.
4. Directors reserve the right to refuse any entry.
5. Directors reserve the right to correct any error or to make any alteration in the regulations in the Prize List.
6. When the total number of entries in any class is fewer than three, the Directors reserve the right to amalgamate the class with any other of the same type.
7. In previous years the Vermilion Agricultural Society has always paid 100% of the prize money awarded. However, if conditions should arise which make it impossible for this to be done; the said Society reserves the right to pay prize money pro-rata from the receipts of its Annual Exhibition.

LIVESTOCK

8. Water will be furnished free of charge from 5:00 p.m. the day before the Fair, to the evening of the last day of the Fair, for livestock exhibited at the Exhibition. Exhibitors must furnish their own hoses for washing down animals.

9. All registered heavy horses competing for prizes must be owned and registered in the name of the exhibitor at date of Fair and certificates of registration of ownership must be produced to the Director or Directors in charge of the class, if called for.
10. All horses on exhibition must be securely tied.
11. Any exhibitor exhibiting livestock which has not been owned by him 30 days prior to the Exhibition shall forfeit his right to all prizes awarded to him.
12. Any exhibitor exhibiting any animal not owned by him or who knowingly exhibits any animal in any section or class other than the one in which it should be exhibited shall forfeit all prizes awarded to him. ALL EXHIBITS MUST BE OWNED AND REGISTERED IN THE NAME OF THE EXHIBITOR. NOTE EXCEPTION IN THE GET-OF-SIRE CLASS.
13. No exhibitor shall show the same animal in more than one class or in more than one section of a class, except in team or special classes.
14. Animals entered in Youth classes are eligible to compete in the regular classes at the same exhibition, subject to the usual entry fee being charged.
15. No purebred animal can be shown in any section or class other than its own, except where specifically stated in the prize list.
16. Exhibitors of horses and cattle are required to produce the animals in the ring for the purpose of being judged when called upon by the Directors in charge; otherwise their right to any prizes to which they might be entitled will be forfeited.
17. Entry fees will not be refunded under any circumstances unless a Bonafide Veterinary Certificate is presented to the Secretary Manager no later than 48 hours after the show.
18. No animal exhibited shall be decorated with medals or prize ribbons until after the awards are made in their respective classes.
19. No ribbons or awards won prior to the current exhibition shall be shown on the grounds or in the buildings before the second morning of the fair.

JUDGING

20. No person will be allowed to act, as a judge who is in any way interested in the exhibits that person is to judge.
21. Any exhibitor lodging a protest must make it in writing, and it must be delivered to the Secretary within 48 hours after the close of the Exhibition, accompanied with a deposit of \$50.00, cash or certified cheque, which will be forfeited to the Society if the protest is not sustained.
22. NO PERSON WILL BE PERMITTED IN THE RINGS DURING THE TIME OF JUDGING EXCEPT THE JUDGES AND THEIR ASSISTANTS, PERSONS IN CHARGE OF ANIMALS, AND THE DIRECTOR IN CHARGE OF THE CLASSES BEING JUDGED.
23. All prize ribbons and cards, which have been affixed by the judges, must be displayed after judging has been completed.
24. Where not more than two exhibits in livestock classes are shown in any section, no first prize will be awarded except where the judge considers the animal merits it.
25. Any exhibitor who makes a false entry or who shall attempt to interfere with or influence the judges while in discharge of their duties or who shall use contemptuous or abusive language to a judge in consequence of awards made shall forfeit his right to all prizes he might otherwise be entitled to and shall be excluded from exhibiting at this exhibition for two years. Judges are particularly requested to report any infraction of this rule immediately to the Directors in charge.

MISCELLANEOUS

26. The Directors do not hold themselves responsible for any damage to exhibits.
27. No person shall be entitled to claim payment of prizes until 30 days after the awarding thereof.
28. **Stalls will be allotted by the Directors in charge and exhibitors are requested to see them before taking possession of any stall.**

29. Holiday trailer Parking will be available on a first come first served basis. There are limited RV spaces and when they are gone there are no more. **They must be paid for and booked with the Livestock Entries. No plugging into barns.**

PARKING

31. **No vehicles shall be allowed around the show ring or livestock buildings. This is required because of FIRE regulations and public safety.**
32. Any exhibitor making entries, by so doing agrees to be governed by the foregoing rules.
33. IF ANY PROTEST is received regarding the acceptance of any exhibit or the placing thereof the Directors will meet on Monday, August 9th, at 2:00 p.m., for the express purpose of dealing with such protest.

Exhibitors are particularly requested to read ALL the Rules.

Attention is directed to a section of the Animal Diseases Act, as follows: Sec.39 - Any person who brings or attempts to bring into the market, fair, or any other place any animal known by him to be infected with or laboring under any infectious or contagious disease shall, for every such offence incur a penalty not exceeding \$200.00.

34. Inhumane treatment of any animal, inside or outside the ring, **WILL NOT BE TOLERATED.**

LIABILITY: All exhibitors shall be under the control and direction of the Ag. Society but solely at the risk of said exhibitor. The Ag. Society will not be responsible for damage, injury, loss or theft of or to any exhibit, irrespective of the cause of such damage, injury, loss or theft. Each exhibitor will be solely responsible for any loss, injury or damage done to, administered by or arising from any animal or article exhibited by him, for its description as given in the catalogue. This shall indemnify the Agricultural Society against all legal or other proceedings in regard thereto.
